This funding will be used to

- Support 85% of Year 7-10 students to achieve A C results for semester reports for English, Maths Science and HASS, through a range of strategies including case management of individual students
- Support all Year 12 students to receive their Queensland Certificate of Education or Queensland Certificate of Individual Achievement (QCE/QCIA)
- Support senior students to access a viable pathway at the conclusion of schooling through a range of support processes
- Increase the attendance rate of students to 90%
- Support the development of teacher capability to deliver effective teaching of the Australian Curriculum and the senior phase of learning that engages student learning across all faculty areas through targeted professional development and coaching
- Implement targeted pedagogical support to embed the Australian Curriculum General Capabilities, consistent classroom practices and global competencies
- Implement programs that support the wellbeing of students and staff and enhance inclusive practices
- Support student engagement through the provision of resources and the implementation of a range of innovative and entrepreneurial opportunities that align with pathway options for students
- Support students to overcome the barriers of disadvantage through the provision of resources and educational opportunities
