SUBJECT OUTLINE:

Visual Art is an important study of life today. It is a subject that allows students to explore, problem-solve and make meaning of important personal, local and world issues, through the making and critiquing of artworks.

Students who select to study Year 10 Art will become actively involved in the practice of making and analysing a diverse range of artworks. They will experiment individually with a range of exciting art media and techniques to produce ceramic works, sculptures, mixed media drawings, prints and paintings. They will view and appraise a diversity of artworks.



ASSESSMENT OUTLINE:

A wide range of assessment techniques are used to judge student achievement. These include:

- * **Visual Journals** that record the development of students' artworks.
- * **Folios of experimental artworks.**
- * **Written artwork analyses**, essays and critiques.
- * **Resolved artworks.**
